LHS Awards Diplomas To Class Of 145

One hundred forty-five Lansingburg High School seniors last night received their diplomas from Ramon L. Mason, president of the Board of Education, in commencement exercises at Knickerbocker Junior High School Auditorium.

Fifty-one prizes and scholarships were presented to members of the Class of 1964 by Lansingburg's School Superintendent Howard E. VerGow.

And after the salutatory address, "Dedicated Purpose," by Miss Lee Finkle, the valedictorian, William Lorenson, keyed the commencement exercises to the Nation's most prominent issue with his address on "Civil Rights: The Negro Revolution."

Lorenson traced the position of the Negro in the United States and outlined the current situation before urging passage of the Civil Rights Bill and other steps to insure the equal citizenship long promised Negroes.

"While Americans must give up their assumed superiority," he declared in a moving conclusion.
